

# Chapter 22 - शह

This chapter features 4 words that begin with “शह”

शहुप - ‘to wash’

शिह - ‘one’

शहो - ‘wheat’

शहशहे - ‘saw’

## Page 1 activities:

- Begin by writing each word 4 times each.
- Think of other words in the Nyeshangte language that begin with शह.
- Using the 4 featured words, choose the word that best fits each sentence and write it in the blank space.
- Create your own sentences using the 4 featured words.

## Page 2 activities:

Chapter 22 Spelling Rule: To show possession or ownership, a noun takes the suffix -ल.

Adding this suffix does not change the spelling of the noun.

चु शिकीको डल। - ‘This book is mine.’

(\*This suffix is not used for familial terms: कय आप हानीरी मो? - ‘Where is your father?’)

The phrase that means ‘before’ in the Nyeshangte language is written as शिले नाराड right after the verb.

कय शिकी चप शिली नाराड, ड तुकाडरी यच्ये।

- शह is a consonant cluster that is unique to the Nyeshangte language. Read the nine example words that use this letter.
- Write the number words in the blank space under each of the three numbers.
- Read the examples of the -ल ownership marker. Fill in the four blank spaces with your own answers.
- Read the examples of शिली नाराड then complete the following three sentences.
